
**Celebrating God's Mission of New Life**  
Sunday, November 6, is All Saints Sunday, a day in which we celebrate new Life in Christ. We will do that as we have done the last few years, by remembering those who have died in the past year and giving thanks for those who have been baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus in the past twelve months. There will be an opportunity for all worshippers to place a candle in honor or memory of a beloved one who has died or been baptized.

Our Bishop, The Rev. Paul Erickson, will worship with us, The All Saints Sunday focus merges with our stewardship theme, Together in God's Mission Life. Elected in June, Bishop Erickson took office in September and serves the churches of the Greater Milwaukee Synod as administrator, leader and pastor. He and his wife are both ELCA pastors. Currently, his wife, Lynn, serves a congregation in St. Paul, MN. In the near future she and their daughter will move to the Milwaukee area.

Following worship, Bishop Erickson will be at the Adult Forum, speaking about the ministries we do as a synod, ministries of which we are a part. The adult forum time will give you time to interact with him in a more personal way. You will be able to ask him questions about what we do with the other 130 congregations in our area.

In the midst of this busy day, we will also give thanks to God for the ministry of Christine Shander, our Christian Growth Coordinator. She recently announced plans to leave CTK in order to change careers. She will be taking on the mantle of Director of Human Resources for a small local business.

New life never comes without change. A seed never bears fruit unless it dies in the ground. The resurrection to new life only comes through death. So, we keep our eyes on the cross and remember that though the earth should change, God is in the midst of us. God is our refuge and strength.

### **Fall Adult Forums 2016**

**Adult Forum meets on Sundays at 10:15ish, most weeks of the month.**

**November 6:** Bishop Erickson  
We will focus on God's call to be "Together in God's Mission of New Life." Bishop Paul Erickson of the Greater Milwaukee Synod will be with us. We will also observe the Festival of All Saints. As we remember those who have been joined to Christ's death and resurrection through baptism and/or death, we will call one another to consider how our ministry is a ministry of life for the sake of others. Bishop Erickson will present during the Adult Forum.

**November 13-** We will focus on God's call to be "Together in God's Mission in Uncertain Times." This worship will happen days after election day; we will be in a time when many will feel uncertain, perhaps even let down by the election. There will be no adult forum on this day. Instead, we'll celebrate Veterans Day by honoring those who practiced Christian vocation in service to God during very uncertain times.

**November 20-** Stewardship Sunday  
We will focus on God's call to be "Together in God's Mission through Christ the King." Goulden Brass will be present in worship, providing an extra musical punch to our service. More about this special day will be announced later. There will be a congregational event that follows worship.

**December 4- Safety in Today's World**

There is room for 50 adults on this trip. ## Stairway to Heroin

Sylvia Kreutzmann, along with other CTK members, attended the Stairway to Heroin presentation last month at Lake Country Elmbrook. Sylvia has given us the following synopsis of what was talked about:

The group of presenters goes to area schools and churches. The session had many adults and several teens. There were 190 pairs of shoes up on bleachers on the stage facing the audience representing 190 Lake Country people who have Overdosed on opiates/heroin in the years from 2012 to 2015.

It is an epidemic. It often starts with prescription medications from Doctors who prescribe too much pain meds. Tylenol and Ibuprofen and heat or ice can relieve pain as well as the opiates because they act differently in the brain.

Parents need to know where their kids are and who they are with and what they are doing. Parents should find something their kids like and "specialize" in that with them. Like a sport or a hobby etc. Parents need to check their kids rooms . It is your house and their rooms can be good hiding places for drugs. Watch what they are doing on the computer. Many kids, esp boys, are watching lots of porn and that too gets addictive.

One of the speakers, a local policeman said that being a parent sucks today since you have to say NO so much. He and assistant DA also spoke about how bad marijuana is, often a starting point to other drugs. He said in Colorado where it is now legal there have been multiple arrests for child abuse and neglect since the law passed.

They spoke directly to the kids and said when you see something, say something. Tell a friend, tell a teacher, tell someone. All bodies are different, one girl took 1/2 tab [just to try it] and died.

**Parents, tell your kids you love them, hug them. Spend time with them. Prevention is the key.**
