1. I attended the April Executive meeting and Council meeting.

The blessing of Maintenance to Mission projects was held on April 17 at both services. Presenters were Derek Brammeier and Robin Weiss.

All God's Children held an event on May 2, May Day Madness, which was well attended and everyone enjoyed an evening of food, games, an auction and social time. A big thank you to Laurie Wilson and the staff and board of AGC.

The Gift Acceptance Committee met in April and the committee discussed the following items: Amy Bonesho, Education chair, submitted a request to fund Godly Play for \$8000.00. (The Godly Play proposal was given to each member of the Gift Acceptance Committee for review in the beginning of April). Since that time, Christine amended the request with approval from Amy Bonesho, to a request of \$2000. Christine was very diligent and creative in finding ways to make this much more affordable by substituting some of the materials with other items and having people make some of the items also. (Play pieces and bookshelves). In the current church budget, \$600 has been allocated to get this project off the ground. Christine would like to have everything in place for this project by June 4. The committee asked that a motion to approve \$2000 for Godly Play be presented to the council at the May meeting. The committee also reviewed three areas to house Godly Play, the library, the conference room and the cry room. The committee supports the use of the cry room for various reasons.

Two motions will be presented at the council meeting:

Motion 1: Motion to approve spending of \$2000 from restricted gift funds to use for the purpose of purchasing supplies and program materials for Godly Play as presented by the Education committee.

Motion 2: Motion to use the existing cry room for the Godly Play program.

As no other requests came in, the only outstanding items on the "wish list" include the organ for \$10,000. The committee decided to "hold" the organ request to review at a later date as we would like to see if worship will need funds for the AV system also.

NOTES:

- Regular Contributions through April 30 continue to outpace the first 4 months of last year by about \$9,200.
We received \$925 in donations to cover the cost of musicians for the Contata. That is the good news! However, we continue to struggle to meet our monthly operating expenses of about \$40,000, and therefore continue to use restricted funds to pay regular operating expenses.
- The \$19,725 excess of Total Income vs Total Expenses (line 36) looks good, but we need to understand that we would be showing a \$20,000 deficit if it were not for the over \$44,000 in Memorial Funds received
At the current rate, we will have spent the majority of those (or other restricted funds) by year-end.
- Mission Support of \$2,000 was paid to the Greater Milwaukee Synod.
- Expenses are, for the most part, within budget. We should come in under budget for Insurance, but will probably go a little over budget in Maintenance.
- Maintenance to Mission fund balance is \$13,752, of which \$4,797 is designated for Mission Support. Change to Change the World contributions total \$1,580.
- Checking Account Balance on April 30 was \$128,283. Our Restricted Funds were \$142,156, which means means we have now used \$13,873 in restricted funds for operating expenses.

Building & Grounds Committee: Kirk Carlson

Property & Grounds Report May 2016

We have several volunteers that are weeding the gardens and cleaning out dead vegetation.

We are putting together a set of plans to build a second garage next to the existing garage. Since the sale of the Trinity House, it has been very difficult to manage the lawn care equipment in the same space that AGC and the Boy Scouts use. The new space will make it more practical to maintain the equipment onsite rather than pay for outside service. It will make life easier for the volunteers that need hoses, shovels, rakes etc.

The Boys Scouts have asked for permission to build a small parking pad on the north side of the parking lot where they park their trailer.

We recharged the water system storage tank with compressed air which is an annual maintenance item.

We are updating the lighting in the Great Hall. People have complained that the room is not bright enough. We decided to replace 5 of the lamps with LEDs at a cost of \$1000. These lamps put out about 50% more light using the same amount of electricity. There are 15 lamps remaining. The current plan is to replace lamps that burn out with the new LED's so the changeover will be spread over several budget years. Once complete, the new lamps could last 10 years or longer.

We repaired a leaking HVAC valve in the custodian's storage room.

The AC in Dean's old office is out. We are getting estimates to repair it. We are looking into ways to improve the lighting in this office.

We helped out Membership Ministries and the Sign Committee as Tom Kreklow recovered.

We are planning to repair the roof above the Church office which was postponed last fall due to cold.
