Food For The Table: Fear and Love

I remember sitting on the front porch of a home in North Dakota. The warm wind of the prairie was stirring in the fields, bringing the smell of freshly mown hay to us as we talked across the porch table. Sitting across from me was a woman whose name I cannot recall. She was elderly and a regular part of my home communion rotation. We visited for a time as her dog rested at my feet. I was thankful for the warm breeze that kept us outside. For, I had been in her house and I knew that her dog took advantage of her aging eyes and failing sense of smell.

I wrestled with an inner conversation: "Lindsay," I kept saying, "focus on her." I was distracted by what I feared was coming. I worried that she'd take me inside and seat me at her kitchen table surrounded by Fido's sly subversion. I didn't enjoy visiting her. Fear kept me at a distance.

Fear creates distance between people and our brains are hard-wired to work this way. That which threatens causes us to fight or flee. Both responses create distance. A fire will either make us run away or rush for the extinguisher. Dashing out the door, we put distance between the threat and ourselves. Fighting a fire, we push it out of existence, extinguishing from our presence that which threatens.

There is a lot of fear at work in our world, right now. The bomb blast in England makes us wonder about our safety. It causes us to look at people and wonder if they might be threats. Stories on the news about shootings in the central city make us fear for safety in Milwaukee. Therefore, we separate ourselves from the places where we are afraid. In addition, when we see somebody we think looks like they might be a part of "those people," we clutch purses more tightly and think about how to move away. Fear of neighbors causes us to build fences (even walls) between "them" and us

Jesus, though, calls us to be guided by a force stronger than fear. Jesus says, "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.'" (Matthew 5:43-44) He calls us to let love be the guiding force in us. This love, the writer of 1 John reminds, is rooted in God and is a part of our lives. "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear." (1 John 4:16 & 18)

Christian love is not simply a sentimental notion, a matter of the heart, or a pretty phrase. Christian love is an action. Love rooted in God is lived out in service to others. It calls us to act, long before the heart is engaged. Christian love drives us toward others, even when fear might cause us to run. Christian love works to make relationships right. It tears down walls and invites "the other" in, and compels us to go to those who are different than we are. (*continued pg. 5*)

CTK Financial News

Our mortgage balance as of April 30 was \$425,928. It was renewed for a fixed rate of 4.5% for the next 3 years, increasing our monthly payment by about \$43.00 to \$4,111 per month. Our \$50,000 Line of Credit was also renewed for an additional 3 years. It carries a variable rate of 1 plus prime with a minimum rate of 4.25%. The current rate is 5.0%.
