Alive and Growing Through God's Grace

This issue of the Advocate marks the beginning of our fall ministry. So much has been planned and we are ready to engage one another as a congregation that is “Alive and Growing through God's Grace.”

Sunday School begins, Sunday, September 18. You'll note from Christine's Announcements that we're returning to a “during-service” model. Children will be dismissed during worship to attend education. Godly play will be a big part of that ministry.

Adult Forum will start up again, Sunday, September 18. As done last year, we'll have a variety of topics throughout the year. In September we'll consider scriptures that are at the heart of the faith. In Sundays that follow, we'll consider the value of money in our lives, learn about mental health issues, and remember the basic story of Martin Luther. Much has been planned, so be ready to grow in faith and understanding as we gather each week, following worship, in the Great Hall. Christine and the Education Team are planning activities for children during the Adult Forum.

Wednesday nights continue to be an important part of our life together. We're planning to expand our ministry on Wednesdays as the season goes on. The night is getting a name to reflect an over-arching goal. We're going to experiment with calling Wednesday “Life Night” and in the near future hope to provide a weekly meal throughout the school year to help people engage more fully in the various ministries of the night. So, the meal, when it begins, will be available for the Bell Choir, the Sanctuary Choir, Discipleship Training, and others who wish to join in. This meal will start later in the year.

Another part of Life Night will be rolled out in the near future. We're going to offer “Life Groups” for people to grow in faith and relationship. Life Groups will be small group experiences, especially aimed at helping people find meaningful connections with others in the congregation through mutual study, prayer, and support. Rich Quinlan and I are working together and hope that those who are not, yet, engaged in a small group experience, might find Life Groups to be a place for them to grow.

There's a lot happening. We are God's Church in the Lake Country, called to be “Alive and Growing in God's Grace.” Be involved and grow in faith.

"The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully[a] will also reap bountifully. 7 Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 2 Corinthians 9:6-7

PAY ATTENTION and focus all of your being on listening. What do you hear.....

.....the youth of our congregation coming forth, truly excited to participate in Change to Change the World.

.....all around you hear "Pssst-come over here"

..... the sounds of a few coins hitting the bottom of the plastic cup

.....the sound is different now, the coins are hitting other coins that line the bottom of the cup.

.....the sound of footsteps as the kids head to the altar

.....and then we hear this magnificent CRESENDO as the contents of cup after cup is poured into a single container! What a wonderful sound as our giving takes on new meaning when we can clearly hear the impact of many giving a portion of their gifts back to God.

Week after week, the adults at CTK miss the auditory cues that happen during Change to Change the World. Many of us use Simply Giving and there is no sound at all. There are those of us who put paper (our check) in a piece of paper (our envelope-because we remembered it) and drop it in the offering plate.

Some of us are really noisy, we don't use any envelope and we drop our cash or check in the plate. Ooops-wait a minute, the plate that is lined with felt! Who was the genius that had the bright idea to make giving at church a silent activity?

Our regular giving at church when combined with the generosity of our fellow members, results in a Song of Praise as we

give back to God what he has so generously blessed us with.

The next time you drop your gift in the offering plate, may a cymbal of celebration crash in your head to underscore the fact that you are truly a Cheerful giver. Michael Groh

Mental Health Care Regardless of Ability to Pay

Nearly one in five adults in Wisconsin reports suffering from a mental illness, according to Mental Health America. And, one in five adults who have a mental health disability say it's hard to get care because of the cost.

That's why LSS has established sliding scale fees for self-pay clients at its 10 mental health counseling clinics around Wisconsin. It makes mental health care affordable, because the fees are based on an individual client's income, family size and ability to pay. LSS also accepts some insurance plans and Medical Assistance. LSS mental health services include:

- Assessments to diagnose mental health issues
 - Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA) assessments
 - Individual outpatient counseling all ages
 - Group counseling for people who have similar issues
 - Outpatient counseling for substance abuse issues

2016 Walk To End Alzheimer's

The biggest fundraiser to combat Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia is the annual Walk to End Alzheimer's. In Waukesha Co. this occurs on the 2nd Sat. in Sept., the same date as the Outreach For Hope Bike Ride. Though I have participated in the Walk for several years, I haven't solicited funds from CTK members because of the overlap in dates with the Bike Ride. When Pastor Jim Bickel, director of Outreach For Hope, was here in winter, I asked him about the possibility of conflict in collecting funds. Pastor Jim said there is no conflict; the funds collected are for different purposes. I approached CTK's Outreach Committee, requesting permission to solicit funds for the Alzheimer's Walk, and they said "Go ahead." The goal this year for Waukesha Co. is \$193,000.

I personally have benefitted from work done by the Alzheimer's Association, prior to June's death from complications of Alzheimer's disease in 2012. Thank God for those who donated in years past, resulting in research and medication which gave us six years after her diagnosis. Thank God for support groups and seminars sponsored by the Alzheimer's Association, which gave me much needed support as a caregiver.

There will be people at CTK who will be affected by Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia. I can do my part by asking for money which will aid others in their journey. You can do your part by sponsoring my participation. I will be soliciting support after the worship services on Aug. 28 and Sept. 4. If you prefer, you can donate online by going to the website, 2016 Waukesha Co. Walk to End Alzheimer's. When you bring up the home page, it will give you an opportunity to donate.
