## A Message From Our President

### What is Your Passion?

CTK continues to be blessed with many gifts in the forms of time, talent and financial resources. People give based upon their ability, their faith and their passion. People tend to give generously to specific requests, such as capital campaigns, specific projects or items or events because it is a passion. However, I want to remind everyone that we need to support our budget with regular giving as these operational funds pay our gifted and faithful staff so that they may carry out programing. These funds also provide for a wonderful facility that needs maintenance, repairs, upgrades and janitorial servicing. All this is needed to support our missions.

We use our facility to provide programs and support missions and our use keeps increasing. We provide use of the facility to All God's Children, Family Promise, blood drives, AA meetings, senior lunches, Lake Country Quilting, Boy Scout troop 20, music recitals and lessons, concerts, community forums related to outreach, such as sex trafficking, reaching out to the community through VBS, the Christmas tea and other programs. Our 2017 Thanksgiving Dinner saw an increase of 20% as we fed over 500 people on the eve of Thanksgiving. Our programs and events bring in hundreds of people from our community. Last December, within 2 days we had over 800 come in our doors to attend worship, the Christmas concert, Family Promise and the Christmas tea in addition to regular Monday happenings. We have a very full calendar packed with events and programs every week!

Of the items listed above, where does your passion lie? Housing and supporting those in Family Promise, providing VBS to a hundred children in the local community, hosting programs on topics such as sex trafficking or one of the other items listed above? We need funds to provide for staff, programming and facilities to ensure all these programs (and more) continue.

The cost associated with using our facility, having staff and programing is around \$40,000 a month which is supported by our regular giving. However, our giving is not keeping up with what we need to pay our bills. We were short in obtaining the funding needed to support our operational budget last year and several years prior. And if you have been reading the Treasurer's report monthly, you should know that we are down in giving in 2018. While regular giving doesn't enthuise most people, it should. Look at what it provides! Without a facility, staff and programming we wouldn't be able to carry out the missions of Christ the King.

As we move forward with our new parking lot in the next few months, the money in our checkbook will decrease significantly leaving a balance of approximately 4 months' worth of expenses. This will also be during the summer season when we traditionally have a downturn in regular giving. Please remember when you get ready for your vacation or extended absence, send a check to CTK or better yet, sign up for simply giving so funds can be contributed on a regular basis.

Remember, that while giving to a specific item or cause can be exciting, in order to have a sound future we must contribute regularly to our operational fund so we can continue to spread God's Word through our worship, programs and mission work.



**Update On Our Finances and Parking Lot Project**

This should not be news to anyone as it has been discussed each year at the annual meeting. During this time, the church has needed to pull monies from our "restricted" funds to pay for general operations as our regular giving amounts have not kept up with the monthly operating expenses.

We have been blessed with yet another gift from the Hoffman Estate that will allow us to have some monies in our general operating account after the parking lot project monies are allocated. In February there were no unusual expenses incurred which is unusual in a building as old as ours. The changes to the accounting system have been completed. There are 4 levels of accounts that make up our financial system.

1. Accounts held in CTK's name at various institutions. The largest is the checking account at Waukesha State Bank
2. Restricted Funds are sub accounts in the checking account. These are typically long term funds that exist for more than a single fiscal year. They are generally established by the Gift Acceptance Committee and dispersed with the approval of the Church Council. Change to Change the World is an example of a restricted fund
3. In and Out funds. These are typically short term in nature and related to specific committees or activities where it is necessary to track income and expenses. The Adult Houston Trip is an example of an In and Out fund.
4. General and Administrative funds are used to operate the church. All unrestricted contributions become part of the G&A fund. Expenses such as salaries, mortgage utilities and maintenance are part of this. The Annual Budget which is approved by the Congregation sets the fiscal plan for the year. When giving does not keep up with expenses we operate at a deficit by borrowing from restricted funds.

Historically all of the above accounts were documented in the annual report. The new accounting software installed at the beginning of the year allows for a consolidated view of all the accounts on an ongoing basis.

**Giving** Unrestricted giving varies throughout the year but in a predictable way. Historically, February is the second worst month followed by June. At the same time expenses are nearly constant month to month. Giving this month was up from 2017 but down from 2015 and 2016. In order to smooth out the bumps the treasurer tries to keep a balance of working capital equal to 3 months of expenses.

It is difficult to discern a trend looking at week-to-week attendance. However, the totals through the first ten weeks of the year indicate that there is a clear decrease in attendance when compared to the previous two years.

**Summary**

The General and Administrative expenses average about \$40,000. The deficit widened in February and was driven by lower giving, an early utility payment, and the bill for the new furnace which was installed in January and paid in early February. The Church is operating per the budget. The problem is not expenses, it is giving.
