New ADA Power Door Openers

Christ the King recently installed five new power door openers. We were able to do this through the very generous contributions of two anonymous donors. Many thanks to Jerry Spencer for designing the system.



Both outside and inside doors at the front church entrance are powered, both inside and outside doors at the All God's Children entrance are powered, and the outside door near the coat room is powered. The outside opener buttons are located near the key pad for unlocking the doors at off hour times, and inside for easy access. Off hours, the door must be unlocked before the opener will work. Entering a pin code in the key pad unlocks the door. The powered doors are identified by a large symbol on the door. If needed, there is a switch to "hold open" the door on the end of the opener mechanism.

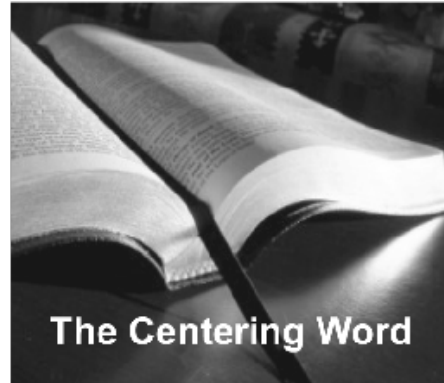

CTK's Care Ministry-Sylvia Kreutzmann



Sylvia attended the viewing of Screenages in Oconomowoc. It was an hour long with a panel discussion afterwards answering questions from the audience. About 150 parents and kids were there. They

showed many pictures of kids on their phones emphasizing the over stimulation in the brain which is still developing. Too much dopamine gets released making it such a good feeling and may lead to addiction. They suggested making a contract with your kid allowing use of phone at certain times. Many kids have trouble sleeping so they suggest no phones at bedtime, maybe discontinue using them 2 hours prior to bedtime and then doing something relaxing. Kids are losing communication skills, like talking to each other using eye contact. Writing skills are being lost. After school activities are good. Parents need to be good role models and not be on their phones all the time. One of the Oconomowoc counselors said the school now does not allow phones in the classroom or study halls. Can use them at lunch. Evidently this is a new policy as some of the senior students came to the counselor and said they wished they had that policy when they were freshmen.

Krista Hull, founder and executive director of Redeem and Restore Center (RRC), has started a program called "We Back the Badge, which is really a law enforcement blessing drive. This drive will go through October.



The list of items is short: snack bars, nut pouches, fruit snacks, trail mix, mints and mini candy bars.

Once items are collected, care packages will be assembled and delivered to all the hubs in Waukesha and Washington Counties. In addition to snacks, care packages will include a note of gratitude and RRC contact information. The hope is threefold: to show appreciation, build a stronger relationship with local law enforcement and offer training.

You may recall we supported RRC during our Candlelight Service for all people affected by human trafficking, which was held last spring at the Delafield Presbyterian Church. RRC is working very hard to establish a long-term safe home for survivors in our area. The goal is to provide mental, physical, emotional and spiritual healing support. Hull also offers Human Trafficking 101 to the public, which is a great introduction. Some CTK members have attended this course. The bin is located in the upper sanctuary. Let's partner with RRC and support local law enforcement by stuffing our bin to the brim!

Their respect rang out loud and clear. Ellen spoke about how she was not sure he would make it when he first arrived and how proud she is now that he has succeeded. Words are powerful and everyone was happy to share kind words. The best words, however, came from Alfonso! He stood to thank his friends, the staff and the meal volunteers stating that he would not have been able to persevere without the help of each. He talked about being responsible for his actions and moving forward. He reflected on the day he decided to change his life. It was the day that he spent his last five dollars to get the referral to Serenity Inns program. He choked out the words, "That was the best five dollars I have ever spent!" as we clapped and struggled to keep our eyes dry!

To our CTK volunteers - Thank you a million times over for your impact on others! Your works touch more people than you know. These men and their families are eternally grateful to all of you!
