I've been asked to share some information about our liturgy and the changes that happen depending on the church season. Lutherans hold much in common with other denominations that use a liturgy. There are four general parts of the worship service as it is normally practiced in our congregations; Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. There are several pieces under each of these general headings, many that are optional or variable, again depending on the occasion and seasons of the church year.

I won't give a full description of all the parts of a worship service here but I'll focus on what might change during the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is on March 6th which begins the season. There are 40 days in this season, not counting Sundays. Traditionally, Lent is a penitential season with reflection on Jesus' death on the cross and is often marked by increased devotion and more focus on caring for the needs of others. The character of worship might match the season i.e. somewhat more subdued as opposed to the season of Easter with a joyous full liturgy. The setting of the service may also change during Lent. For the weeks of Christmas and Epiphany we have been using setting four from Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW). We will likely switch to setting three from ELW, which is familiar from the Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW) setting one.


For Lent we will likely omit the canticle of praise and include the Kyrie "Lord, have mercy". The Apostles' Creed is normally used in Lent in place of the Nicene Creed recited during the seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Easter.

Many congregations refrain from using any form of "Alleluia" during Lent but bringing it back on Easter.

The parts of the liturgy are simply sung scripture verses. Whether you realize it or not you have memorized many scripture verses simply by singing the liturgy each Sunday. When you come to worship during the next weeks pay attention to the things that change and the pieces that remain the same. We come to offer our praise and thanks to God and receive God's gifts to us in the meal and the word.

Thanks for joining me on this brief tour of our worship practice.

Featuring Antonio Vivaldi's choral classic,
"Gloria"



The music ministry of Christ the King with assistance from organ maestro, Bruce Bengtson, cantor emeritus from Luther Memorial Church in Madison, Daniel Birnschein, trumpet from the Milwaukee Ballet Orchestra, Jamie Hofman, violinist and violist who frequently appears with the Milwaukee Symphony, and Alex Mortensen, oboist from Oconomowoc, will perform Vivaldi's setting of the greatest hymn of praise in western Christianity, the "Gloria in excelsis Deo" (Glory to God in the highest).

Vivaldi (1669-1741), a contemporary of Johan Sebastian Bach, and leader of the Italian Baroque, is well known for his tuneful and optimistic musical style. His "Four Seasons" is an instrumental classic. In the Gloria, he takes this classic hymn of praise apart into twelve movements highlighting the distinctive character of praise, prayer, penitence and petition. The work concludes with a great doxology written as a double fugue.

The Sanctuary Choir will lead this with various soloists and a duet by members of the chorus. Interim Pastor, Rev. Jim Holmberg, will introduce the text. Various instrumental solos and chamber works will fill out the hour program. The public is invited. A free will offering will be received. Concert length will be approximately one hour.


