Chapter 4.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

- *C4.01. The Church is a people created by God in Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, called and sent to bear witness to God's creative, redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the world.
- *C4.02. To participate in God's mission, this congregation as a part of the Church shall:
 - a. Worship God in proclamation of the Word and administration of the sacraments and through lives of prayer, praise, thanksgiving, witness, and service.

The first part reminds us of who we are, created by God, redeemed by Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit. We are sent into the world to bear witness, to tell the story of God's amazing love in Jesus. As we move through the process during this interim period, part of that journey is a careful look at our calling. What does it mean to be the church? You might not think that our constitution is terribly important or interesting. I get that. A constitution can be a long and sometimes tedious collection of details. In reality the constitution is a mission document that both keeps us on track and directs our attention to where we need to be going.

As always, be in prayer about this process and for the mission Christ calls us to.
Alleluia, Christ is Risen! Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Our CTK group of 9 joined with several other churches to create a team of 48 people who worked in Trenton, New Bern, New Port areas. We formed 7 work teams. Two teams stayed at Camp Albermarle while 5 traveled to work sites. Of the two teams at camp, one team was the fabulous kitchen crew who began their work at 5am each day to prepare a hot breakfast, set out a smorgasbord of food for us to pack in our lunches, cooked dinners and desserts, grocery shopped and washed a great many pots and pans! The second team worked on camp repairs. The other 5 teams met home owners and worked to repair homes. Each home was in a different state of repair. One needed a new floor... from the floor joists up! It was a massive job! Another needed a new wall, the whole wall! One entire side of the house! Other homes were ready for drywall. Many of us hauled and hung a lot of sheet rock!!! We also taped and mudded to prepare the homes for the next step...paint! Watching the homeowners see their house start to look like a house with rooms as opposed to a big space with a lot of 2X4s was so rewarding. The smiles and "happy dances" were such a pleasure to witness. One owner and her grown son even broke into song! They clapped and sang hymns while we worked!

That was truly inspirational! We are so grateful for the donations from CTK which helped to purchase supplies and tools to get this work accomplished!
