Many of us go to cottages during the weekend, travel, follow our kids to their baseball or soccer games, and generally try to squeeze in as much outside time as we can. That's sounds like a good plan. At the same time, we can get creative and do some planning on how we and our families can maintain a strong faith and worship life during the summer months.

When traveling during the weekends, seek out a congregation that's along your route. It is often very enriching to worship with another congregation in a different part of the country. Notice what they do differently or the same as you've experienced. Does the congregation do a good job in welcoming guests? Share with us what you found helpful or not so much.

If you are traveling with children, you may want to find a book or series to enjoy while you travel. On some of our major family camping trips we used cassettes (yes, it was some time ago) to share stories like The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe by Madeline, L'Engle. Today there are some good podcasts or audio books that can help pass the time and provide discussion worthy lessons. I know it's a challenge to tear our kids away from a screen but it's worth the effort if you can manage it.

Put your smart phone to work by add the dailyLectio app. It is a free app that gives the appointed readings for each day of the year. They are related to the previous Sunday readings or the following.

Finally, remember that it is not what we do but what God has already done for us in Christ. God's grace is abundant and God's love is poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. Count on it.

## **CTK MET - On Our Way In The CALL Process**

The Mission Exploration Team (MET) is a group charged with creating the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) to be used during the Call for our next pastor. The MSP is a summary of the characteristics and ministry of our ministry site and will serve as the first impression that will be shared with prospective candidates. The completed profile will be shared with the congregation and the synod bishop on September 15 in the adult forum following the service. The profile will then be used during the Call process.

The MET was appointed by the CTK council and follows the guidelines of the Greater Milwaukee Synod. MET members include: Donna Finch, Kathie Ferree, Brooke Muenta, Toni Schnorr, Jerry Spencer, Bill Myers, Brian Udovich, Pastor Jim Holmberg (interim pastor), Pastor Jim Stein (community member) Pat Neudecker (facilitator)

The team met three times since organizing in April. The May congregational listening session (70 participants), and 22 interviews of all church staff and committee chairpersons have been completed. Summaries of themes will be used in the profile. The MET is currently collecting additional CTK data and constructing a congregational survey which will be available during the month of July. All work has been framed by three questions: What are the joys of our CTK? What are the sorrows? What areas of focus will be important for a new pastor? Once completed, a draft of the MSP will be presented to the congregation during a visit with the synod bishop in September. At that time, the MET process will be complete, and the Call will begin.

The time of calling a pastor can be a special time for reflection and prayer in the life of a congregation. This time of

transition is an opportunity for our congregation to grieve, heal, reflect, and celebrate our CTK past. It is a time to assess our current CTK strengths and challenges, create hope for our future, and call a new pastor. The MET appreciates your prayers and support during this important time for CTK. ## **Would You Like To Receive Communion But Can't Get To Worship?**



We have the solution to your problem. You are not alone. Christ the King has 105 members who are over 75 years of age, many of whom are able to get to worship, but several who cannot. We are in the process of developing a ministry whereby Eucharistic ministers (the formal term for people who are trained to bring Communion to your home) will be able to provide that service. Eucharistic ministry is an extension of the worship service, in that the bread and wine which are consecrated during the worship service are sent with the people who make the visits. They share Scripture and prayer along with Communion as part of the visit.
