I look forward to getting back to this regular schedule even though I will miss the summer warmth and time at the beach.

We are saying goodbye to Michelle Scherer, our media coordinator, on August 25th during our Sunday worship. One of the joys of serving as Interim Pastor of Christ the King is working with an exceptional staff. Michelle has been a fabulous addition to this wonderful team, and it is hard to say farewell. However, Michelle has the opportunity to return to a full-time position that was too good to pass up. To say that she will be missed is an understatement for sure. Please join me in expressing gratitude for Michelle. We thank God for her ministry among us and send her with prayer and our love.

As I write this column the personnel committee is in the final stages of interviewing and hiring a candidate for the Faith Formation Coordinator position. Praise God! I thank everyone who has responded to the call to fund this position with dollars and pledges. Our goal is to raise \$60,000 in cash and pledges over three years to give stability and security to this vital position. If you have not already done so, please prayerfully consider making the commitment today over and above your regular giving to the ministry of Christ the King. God is at work here. I know that God can use this position to help build and strengthen the faith of our youth. I see this as a sign of the commitment at CTK to grow our youth ministry program, and to be a start to an even stronger and more robust position in the future. I see good things coming this September.

The Mission Exploration Team (MET) will be completing its work in the next few weeks and we are set to have our Town Hall meeting with synod staff on September 15th at 10:15 am. The MET report will be presented at that time, which includes the results of extensive interviews and surveys with members and a prayerful review of the needs of the congregation, gifts and strengths of a pastoral candidate, an understanding of the area demographics, and potential direction of the ministry. Pat Neudecker as chair, and the entire team have been diligent in their work. The call committee will be officially formed after September 15th and they begin the actual process of the search for a new pastor. Prayer, prayer, and more prayer is essential. What does God want for the ministry here? Are there people who need to hear and experience the love of God in Lake Country? Is God calling the congregation to respond to both the spiritual and physical needs of area residents? What does this look like in the day to day ministry, worship, and outreach of the congregation? What does that mean as you search for a candidate to serve as the next pastor?

Thank you for your continued support and encouragement. I appreciate it more than you can imagine.

Our preschool ministry started in 1976, so we are entering our 44th year of serving children in our community. What a blessing to have this amazing ministry here at Christ the King as we have thousands of AGC alumni in the lake country area. When you are talking about our church, I'm sure that many will remember that we are the church with All God's Children Pre School.

Our preschool offers half day programs that meet 2, 3 or 5 days a week for children ages 2 ½ to age 5. Our enrollment for fall is one of the largest we have had in many years. Thanks so much for the referrals and kind words about our preschool ministry we have right here at Christ the King. We have 77 children enrolled for fall which makes us so excited for the year and can't wait to welcome them into our AGC family!

This fall will mark the start of our tenth year as a Kettle Moraine School District 4K partner which means that any child that is a Kettle Moraine School district resident and is 4 by Sept 1 may enroll in our 4K Froggy Fives classroom without any tuition.

This has been a wonderful community connection and proud to work collaboratively with the district. Our supplies are ordered, our classrooms and rugs have been cleaned by Joel over the summer and our staff is getting things prepared for our start of preschool. We are ready for a fantastic year!!

Rochelle Melnarik and Sheri Trafton are the co-teachers for our 2 ½ to 3 year old children in our Rainbow room. We are so happy to have our CTK member Sheri Trafton join our staff this year. Linda Holbrook and Lee Ann Ensweiler will be in our Alligator and Monkey classroom for the children ages 3 ½ to 4 year olds. Debbie Thomas is in our 4K classroom as our dedicated teacher. The assistant teachers are Jessie Bergeron and Casey Brenny who is joining our staff. Nancy Hull is my Office Assistant who I couldn't do without! If anyone is interested in helping in our afternoon enrichments, please feel free to let me know as we would love to have you on our sub list.

Our annual Ice Cream Social is scheduled for Monday, September 30 so keep watch for additional details. Plans are also in the works for another City Lights Brewery fundraiser this fall.

Volunteer Worship Leader Sign Up!

The Worship and Music Committee has been working to find a better and easier way to recruit volunteers for our worship services. We will be launching a new way for you to donate your time as one of the many volunteers who are needed to create and run a worship service. Our new sign up lists seventeen different tasks that are to be completed before, during, and after service. Some of those jobs are communion assistant, greeter, lector, coffee maker, welcome announcer etc. It takes many hands. A google sheets document has been created listing all of these tasks by date. Each column is a different service day. Each row is a task. You will simply click on the box that indicate the job you wish to perform on the date that works best for you. You type in your name and then click on any other box to tell the computer that you are finished. Your name will pop into the box. You are finished! It is simple!

You may be wondering where this wonderful volunteer sign up can be found?? No searching is needed! It will be sent to you every Thursday in your Connections! In the same way that you can click on a button to find the links to previously recorded sermons, you will see an invitation to click on a button to open the volunteer sign up. Click on the link, type in your name, click on another box to make your name pop into the box and you are finished. Sign up for several tasks! Sign up for several days! The google sheet is ready to accept volunteers through the end of 2019 at this time. This is a live document run via Google Sheets. Therefore, all additions are automatically saved. Every time you open the document to see if you can volunteer, the document is current! However, we do ask that you do not make changes to the upcoming Sunday service after Wednesday of that week. This is important because the office staff will look to this sign-up when preparing the bulletin for that upcoming service. We strive to have accurate information in the bulletin. Emergency changes should be handled by calling the coordinator for each of the different jobs.

MUSIC MINISTRY

Calling All Musicians For 2019-2020 Year-All God's Children Got a Place in the Choir (Band or Bells)!

As Christians of the Lutheran tradition we have a rich heritage of praising God and sharing the Good News of Christ's redeeming love through music. Our namesake, Martin Luther, was first and foremost an Old Testament professor at the University of Wittenburg. Yet, during his "exile" year in the Wartburg Castle, he was also a very productive hymn text writer and translator of the entire Bible into German. Luther played the lute and sang in choirs from his youth on. He even funded his school education by singing door to door in groups called "Kurrende Knabe". They sang at the door of homes and "begged" for donations. Like figgy pudding, they "won't go until they get some." Luther would reflect on Scripture at big guest suppers at home and then retire to singing and playing spiritual music with his guests.



Luther knew first hand the power of music to speak to the whole person: heart, mind and soul. He once wrote, "Next to the Word of God, music is greatest gift of God." "Music makes the text come alive!" (Die Musik macht den Text lebendig!) He also knew the power of music to make the Word memorable. He had no time for ministers and superintendents of schools who did not treasure the educational, catechetical power of music. A recent auxiliary bishop of Green Bay, Fr. Robert Morneau, was quoted as saying, "When is the last time you heard somebody humming the homily (sermon) when they left Church?" The very prevalence of musical jingles is a witness to the power of music to make messages memorable. (*"You deserve a break today at"*) Answer below.....

In this day and age when people have many spiritual options including "none", I think we would do well to celebrate one of Lutheranism's great strengths, their heritage of the musical word. Just over the past years you have witnessed children to octogenarians singing and playing God's praise in various, inspiring ways. Their musical offerings have born visible fruit in worship attendance and community building. Hopefully our vital worship with vibrant music can be a calling card to check out Christ the King Lutheran. Why not!?

A musical colleague in the area shared these thoughts on the benefits of joining a church music ensemble: "Making music benefits us in ways we do not completely understand. Many writers have described the positive physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual effects of music. Singing and ringing in a choir improves creativity, social skills, community involvement, academic skills, listening skills, team-building skills, and discipline. In addition, making music with others helps to bridge social gaps, allowing us to connect with people with different backgrounds all coming together for a common goal.

One of the most wonderful rewards of being part of a musical ensemble is the opportunity to create something more beautiful than any one musician could create alone. When you contribute your talents to the musical and spiritual life of the church, you help enrich our collective congregation and nurture the spirit of all." (John Paradowski)

Our musical ensembles will kick off this coming year with the children's choir, Jubilate Singers, singing on Rally Sunday, September 8, 9 am and will rehearse after 9 am worship at 10:15 am for 45 minutes throughout the school year. They will typically sing once a month for worship. The Sanctuary Choir (adults) will start rehearsing September 11th, Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. The Royal Bells will also start September 11, Wednesday, rehearsing from 5.30-6.30 p.m. December 22, Sunday, 3:00 p.m. will be our all music ensemble Lessons and Carols concert. (No Packer game that day!!)

A Pastoral Message on Becoming a Sanctuary Church Body

One of the more controversial decisions of last week's ELCA Churchwide Assembly, held here in Milwaukee, was the decision to "declare the ELCA a sanctuary church body." This action was part of a memorial brought forward by the Metropolitan New York Synod, and after significant debate, the action passed. This occurred on the same day as the Immigration Procession and Prayer Vigil, in which over 700 people walked from the Wisconsin Center to the local office of US Citizenship and Immigration Services and conducted a prayer vigil. It was, for me, a powerful day of witness and action, as we sang, prayed, and declared our common commitments to support immigrants, refugees, and asylum-seekers by means of a "9.5 Theses on Immigration" document. We received a significant amount of press coverage for the events of that day, and while I have received many positive affirmations for our work, I know that these actions are troubling and confusing for others. The topic of immigration is certainly a controversial one in today's political climate, one that seems to divide us into increasingly polarized camps, and there are those who believe that these recent actions have placed us firmly into one of these partisan camps.

As I discussed in my previous message on immigration, my deepest hope is that we can remember that our most fundamental call as followers of the risen Christ is to love our neighbors. As I wrote then, "our call as the Church is simple: we are to love our neighbors. All of them. We are to make that love concrete, risking our own security and privilege to stand with all who are in need. We are to be the Church, reminding one another that we are never alone."

That's what I believe this declaration of being a sanctuary church body is all about. Making our love of neighbor concrete and specific. Some congregations may be in a position to offer physical sanctuary to those seeking refuge from a broken and capricious system; some may be in a position to offer support to those congregations; others may only be in a position to advocate for changes in our immigration laws and policies. The action by the Churchwide Assembly does not and cannot mandate any synod or congregation to engage in any specific action; it does, however, call us to make our love of neighbor real. Additional information on Sanctuary Congregations is available from Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services.

I encourage us all to step back from the rhetoric and partial truths that populate social media and the cable news networks to ask this basic question: What does love look like? It cannot simply be an emotional or intellectual response; Jesus invites us to risk concrete, specific acts of love. My prayer is that this question will guide us all as we explore together what it means to be a church clear about our purpose in this conflicted and challenging world.
